### Spring 2013 Update

I want to dedicate a majority of this article to discussing the municipal development district election being put to our citizens for a vote on May 11, 2013. While I will not use the article to take a position on the matter, I do feel it is important that we are all informed about the steps taken by Council concerning the district policy and any projects for which those funds may be used if passed by our citizens in the upcoming election.

### Municipal Development District

After extensive research and discussion, and holding five public information meetings, the Town's (EDC) Economic Development Committee again recommended

to Council to call an election, requesting establishment of municipal development district within our Town and extraterritorial jurisdiction. The presentations from those public information meetings are available on our website [www.crossroadstx.gov](http://www.crossroadstx.gov) for your review.

Council subsequently voted to call that election which is now on your May ballot. This step simply allows our citizens to ultimately decide if they would like to establish the municipal development district. If the MDD passes by a majority of citizen votes, sales taxes on goods purchased would increase by .25% within the town and ETJ. Currently our sales tax rate sits at 8.00% with the state receiving 6.25% and the town 1.75% on all taxable sales. An increase of .25% would enable the town to receive the maximum available sales tax of 2.00%.

The 2005 the Texas Legislature authorized the establishment of municipal development districts (MDD) in any city. MDD sales taxes are very similar in nature to the economic development corporation sales taxes. Municipal development districts have more flexible spending uses and allow for collection of the tax within a City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Council felt it was important to establish an MDD policy concerning those funds prior to holding an election.

## From the Mayor's Desk *(continued)*

I have outlined the policies that council passed in our April meeting for your review.

- Each July the MDD Board will present to council expenditure projects for the coming year for incorporation into the budget.
- A minimum of two Public input meetings will be conducted concerning MDD expenditure projects alongside annual budget hearings.
- This will be a cash only policy. No bonds or loans will be taken out to complete projects
- Priority levels will be reevaluated and established each year based on citizen input, current opportunities, growth, and projected MDD income from the .25%
- Current project priority levels were set as follows.
  - o Road improvements leading to commercial corridors – High
  - o Public Safety Facility – High
  - o Commercial Water Upgrades – Medium
  - o Acquiring parkland – Medium
  - o Commercial Sewer – Low

These policies and priority levels were established based on citizen input, our last citizen survey and projected revenue from the .25% sales tax if passed, which is estimated to be \$185,000 for 2014.

While \$185,000 would not fully pay for any single road improvement project leading to our commercial corridors, it is a significant amount which would enable the town to proceed with these upgrades much more expeditiously.

While a public safety facility ranked high on both our citizen survey and on the Council priority list, it is a longer term goal simply due to cost of such a facility and a no bond or loan policy. As part of the 380 agreement with Lovett Commercial we will be receiving either two acres of land on sewer or \$250,000 for land acquisition, which will assist this project. As more businesses open in our commercial centers the MDD funds will incrementally increase enabling these types of larger expenditures to be planned in the future.

The parklands and commercial water upgrades were listed as medium priorities due to the probability they can be incorporated into future agreements with developers potentially eliminating the cost entirely to the town.

Commercial sewer upgrades were listed as a low priority due to the extensive cost of the sewer and feedback from citizens concerning growth promotion. Commercial sewer expansion is also an item that has potential for the cost being passed on or shared by future developers or businesses.

I would like to thank the citizens and business owners who participated in the public information meetings and the workshop, sharing your thoughts and perspectives. I would also like to thank both Economic Development Committee and Comprehensive Planning Committee for their work and research on the MDD and potential projects for our town.

I encourage each of you to do your own research on the municipal development district and determine if you feel it is in the best interest of our town, and come out to vote on May 11, 2013.

Commercial Development

I am pleased to announce that Fuzzy’s Tacos has executed a contract for an end-cap restaurant in one of the Lovett Commercial buildings at the Village at Cross Roads. This will give citizens and visitors alike an exciting new option for eating out without having to leave our Town.

A Whataburger building permit was authorized during the April Council meeting, and most likely will have been issued by the time this newsletter arrives in your mailbox. They have a completion date of less than 90 days once construction begins. It will be a standalone restaurant in the Village at Cross Roads along the north side of Hwy 380 just east of FM 424. The Whataburger will give us a twenty-four hour dining option locally.

As you may have noticed, CVS has begun stocking its shelves and is scheduled to open on April 28, 2013. See the business profile article on CVS written by Larry Fisher in this newsletter.

The Walmart project is also well underway and has moved the projected opening date a month ahead of the initial October target. They are now looking to open their doors sometime in September of this year.

Staffing Changes

We have budgeted for some time to have three staff members and with the increase in activity coupled with Judy’s recent retirement it was a great time to fill those positions. Town Secretary Katherine Ritchie has been officially promoted to Town Administrator. We recently hired Shannon DePrater as Town Secretary and Becky Ross as Deputy Town Secretary. You will find profiles on our newest staff members in this newsletter. Please stop by Town Hall and give them a warm welcome and congratulate Katherine on her promotion.




